Digital Citizenship

- States reasons why not to use first and last names when online
- Asks for help at home and at school
- Uses technology to explore educational and personal interests

Information Literacy

- Follows process to check out and return books
- Demonstrates respect for and proper care of library materials
- Recognizes library materials are for shared use
- Identifies author, title, illustrator, spine, spine label
- Identifies front/back cover of the book
- Identifies the difference between fiction and nonfiction
- Recognizes common types of text (e.g., storybooks, poems, etc)

Love of Reading

- Selects a picture book and/or an online resource to share with family
- Identifies the purpose of a library and the role of the media specialist.
- Reads from online author and book sites
- Evaluates grade appropriate quality children's literature
